RE: The Centenary of the end of World War One and Remembrance Sunday 11th November

Several primary and secondary schools in Isleworth are taking part in a project called Isleworth 390. The project is researching into the lives of the 390 WW1 servicemen listed on the Isleworth Memorial, and also finding out more about ordinary life in Isleworth at this period.

The project involves pupils from different schools walking in a parade on Remembrance Sunday, before the Memorial Service. Each student will wear a sash bearing the name of one of the 390 servicemen whose names appear on the Isleworth War Memorial and s/he will also receive a commemorative badge, a scroll, information about their serviceman, and a commemorative programme.

St Mary's School has been invited to send students to represent us in the parade. Key Stage 2 students are invited to take part in this very poignant occasion. Photographs will be taken and the event filmed. These will be available afterwards on the project website: www.isleworthww1.co.uk.

Your daughter/ son will need to meet at 9:50am in the Blue School Hall. Your son/ daughter will need to wear school uniform, with a raincoat (if the weather doesn't look good) and bottle of water.

The parade will move off soon afterwards and then proceed along North Street to Memorial Square with the service starting around 10:50am. After a short service, the parade will return to St Mary's School playground by approximately 11:40.

Once the parade is finished, you will need to collect your child at 11:40. All timings are approximate but we hope that everything will run to the planned schedule.

You are invited to attend the service in Memorial Square, Isleworth and also walk past the special memorial wall in St Mary's School afterwards, where you will see information about the 390 servicemen. We expect that space in the Square will be at a premium this year because of the centenary, so advise you to get there early. Parents are also welcome to walk at the back of the parade, but we have been asked that buggies and dogs are left behind on this occasion, because of safety.
